
### Summer Term




This term our topic is How much do you know about Britain's neighbours? (Europe)

The children will be learning all about the continent and learning about countries and cities within Europe. They will be looking at and identifying features of different countries and then studying both Spain and Poland. We will be looking at what a culture is and looking at relationships within Europe.

In our science lessons we will continue to investigate the conditions needed for successful plant growth. We will then be finding about what animals including humans need to stay upright and move.





## Key Vocabulary

Europe	A group of countries located entirely in the Northern Hemisphere and mostly in the Eastern Hemisphere.
Physical	Physical features like seas, mountains and rivers are natural. They would be here even if there were no people around.
Human	Human features like houses, roads and bridges are things that have been built by people.
City	A city is a large or important town.
Country	A country is land that is controlled by a single government.
Continent	A <i>continent</i> is a massive area of land that is usually separated from others by water or other natural features.
Skeleton	An internal or external framework of bone, cartilage, or other rigid material supporting or containing the body of an animal or plant.
Muscle	All movement in the body is controlled by muscles. Some muscles work without us thinking, like our heart beating, while other muscles are controlled by our thoughts.

There are over 800 cities in the United Kingdom.


- The Sagrada Família remains unfinished and work has been ongoing for over 100 years.
