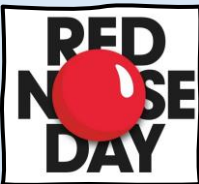

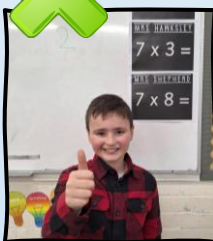
Year 3 trip

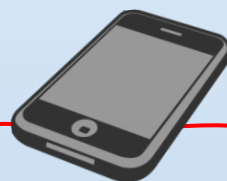


Edward (4T) is currently rehearsing to appear in 'Tales from the toy box' at NAPA. We are really proud of him!
